Idioms	Meaning
 <p>□□□□ [cáng lóng wò hǔ]</p>	Hidden dragons and crouching tigers -- talented men still remained in concealment.
<p>□□□□ [lóng fēi fèng wǔ]</p>	Like dragons flying and phoenixes dancing -- lively and vigorous flourishes in calligraphy.
<p>□□□□ [chéng lóng kuài xù]</p>	A handsome [lucky] son-in-law; a proud son-in-law.
 <p>□□□□ [chē shuǐ mǎ lóng]</p>	Incessant [endless] stream of horses and carriages -- heavy traffic (on the street).
<p>□□□□ [yú yuè lóng mén]</p>	A fish leaping over the dragon gate -- have passed a competitive examination.
