



# Regulation on Transportation of Dangerous Goods

## Safety Marks

Safety marks are the placards, labels and package markings which identify dangerous goods shipments.

## Guides for Dangerous Goods Carriers

- Determine Employee Qualifications
- Determine condition of transport vehicle
- Is the shipment acceptable for transport?
- Is the shipment to be interlined?
- Prior to loading the shipment
- Incident Reports

## Guides for Dangerous Goods Shippers

- Determine the proper shipping name
- Determine the class
- Select the UN Number
- Determine the modes of transport to ultimate destination
- Determine and select the proper packaging
- Prepare the shipping document
- Select the proper safety marks and apply as required
- Loading, blocking and bracing

## Classification of Dangerous Goods

- Explosives
- Gases
- Flammable Liquids
- Flammable Solids
- Oxidizing Substances
- Toxic and Infectious Substances
- Radioactive Materials
- Corrosive Substances
- Miscellaneous Products

## Reporting Requirements

- The shipping name or UN number of the dangerous goods.
- The quantity of dangerous goods initially loaded into the container.
- The quantity of dangerous goods released.
- A description of the condition of the container and details of the conditions of transport when the release occurred.
- A description of the circumstances that led to a catastrophic failure of a cylinder, if involved in the release.
- The location of the accidental release.
- The number of injuries or deaths, if any occurred.
- An estimate of the number of people evacuated as a result of the accidental release.
